Collaborative work is a key factor to address ESL.

One of the key policy messages identifying the critical conditions for successful policies against ESL is to "Promote and support multi-professional teams in schools to address ESL".

Multi-partenarial and professional work needs training: TITA, « Team cooperation to fight early school leaving, Training, Innovative Tools and Actions » is a project dedicated to trainers, practitioners and stakeholders to provide scientific support, tools for action and training in order to prevent ESL.

In order to work on ESL with other professionals and to set up student-centred measures, education staff needs to understand ESL and to develop or strengthen special skills.

The **aim** of the project is twofold:

- Implementing and analysing the impact of new policies which consist in developing cross-sectoral teams in schools
- Professionalising the actors involved in the fight against ESL and realising tools for these actors. Europeans trainers are associated with the analysis and with the production of the created tools

All analysis, tools and results are available on a website (http://titaproject.eu) dedicated to the project.

The outputs of the project are:

- A report on comprehensive evaluation of the multi partnership teams
- An international literature review on researches and main data on ESL
- A mapping of researchers and European experts on ESL
- A video platform analysing the real activity of the multi partnership teams
- An online training course
- Meetings opened to all European trainers.

The French Institute of Education has the leadership of the consortium.

Although the project is not yet finished (the final meeting will be in October), Catherine Pérotin, deputy manager of this institute will present the main results with a special focus to the video platform TITAction.
